You must not sit an examination in the name of another candidate.

You **must not** become involved in any unfair or dishonest practice in any part of the examination.

If you are confused about anything, only speak to an invigilator.

The Warning to candidates must be displayed in a prominent place outside each examination room. This may be a hard copy A3 paper version or an image of the poster projected onto a wall or screen for all candidates to see.

- You cannot leave the room until dismissed by an Invigilator
- Students will be dismissed row by row and must leave quietly
- Please retrieve your bag and leave quickly from the Fitness Room/D Block as lessons may still be on
- After each exam has finished, please do not gather outside Reception. Move to the pedestrian exit if you wish to leave the school

Study Leave

- When you are not in exams you will have Study Leave from Tuesday 7th to Tuesday 21st January inclusive
- This means that you will only attend School for each of your examinations
- When you are not due to sit an exam, we will expect you to go off-site to study
- When you have two exams in one day, three supervised study rooms will be available for Silent Study. These will be given to you when you have signed in at Main Reception after the morning exam

Study Leave

- Please note Study Leave is a privilege. If any Students choose not to follow instructions around the Study Leave arrangements, we may decide to keep you in School
- You should be in full School Uniform for the whole examination period, unless you are at home
- All Students must return to School on Wednesday 22nd January for the Year 11 Sixth Form Taster Day

Study Leave

- Study Leave is not extra holiday time! We recommend that you establish a similar structure to a normal working School Day
- Keep to usual weekday waking up and sleeping times
- Works in 'periods' i.e. focus on one subject or topic for an agreed time, take a break and then swap subjects or topics
- Work with a study partner if this is beneficial to both of you, but keep any socialising to agreed breaks
- Do not access social media during 'school' hours



Self Care - Preparation

- Use a revision timetable to stay on top of revision (be specific about topics/times for each subject)
- Ensure to factor in your rest breaks
- Try to limit use of your mobile phone whilst revising
- Consider if music is distracting or helping
- Don't 'opt out' of family celebrations/gatherings



Self-Care - Exam Days

- Prepare the equipment needed for your exam the night before
- Ensure you eat a decent breakfast before school
- Make sure you get enough sleep
- Try not to discuss papers after the event
