



GCSE Results Day -Thursday 20th August 2026

Dear Parents/Carers and Year 11 Students,

Firstly, congratulations to each and every one of our Year 11 students on successfully completing their exams. The students' hard work, dedication, and commitment throughout the year have been truly commendable, and we have no doubt that they have done their best. We are writing to explain how GCSE Results Day will look this year.

Students will receive an email from the school to their BHS school email address from **08:15** on Thursday 20th August 2026 to advise them of their results. Students are more than welcome to come into school on GCSE Results Day. A paper copy of each student's results will be placed in an envelope and available for collection from the Main Hall between 08:30 and 09:45.

What is the benefit of coming into school on the day?

Coming to school would give students a chance to open their results envelope amongst their peers. The information in the envelope contains the exam board breakdown of component results, whereas the email contains your overall grades only. In school there is the opportunity for support with queries, which may be needed, especially if students have not attained the grades they were expecting. Members of the Senior Leadership Team will be available on the morning of results day to offer advice and guidance and answer any questions.

Who will be allowed on site to collect results?

Students and their parents or carers will be allowed to attend Results Day. Please avoid bringing siblings due to the size of the Main Hall.

Sixth Form Enrolment – GCSE Results Day

Once students receive their results by email, they will need to log in to Applica, linked [here](#), using their school email address and submit their online enrolment form. To maximise chances of securing preferred subjects, **please submit the Applica enrolment form by 10:30** on results day. You may find it useful to read the step-by-step guide linked [here](#), before completing the form.

Applica will only allow students to select A-Level subjects for which they have met the minimum entry requirements. To ensure the chosen combination of subjects can be timetabled, each subject must be selected from different option blocks. Students may only choose one subject per block. Please note that some subjects appear in more than one block, giving greater flexibility. You can view the timetable option blocks [here](#). Students can change subjects from their original application; however, please note that any changes will be processed **after** places have been allocated to those who keep their original selections, as they are given priority.

Once applications have been reviewed and places allocated, successful applicants will receive an email inviting them to accept their offer to join the Sixth Form. The offer will include the subjects allocated to them based on their results and subject availability.

The deadline for accepting or declining the place in the Sixth Form will be clearly stated in the offer email. This enables us to manage a large waiting list and ensure that all available places are offered as quickly and fairly as possible. As a guide, current Becky High students are likely to be asked to respond to their offer **by 14:00** on GCSE results day.

If Students Have Not Met the Entry Requirements

The A Level Options Guide, including subject-specific entry requirements, is available on our website ([click here](#)). **All entry requirements must be met in order to enrol at BHS and to study A Level subjects.**

If you have not met the entry requirements for your chosen subjects but already know which alternative subject(s) you would like to study, you should add this new combination to your Applicaa enrolment form. We will contact you if we are unable to offer these subject(s), for example, if classes are oversubscribed.

If you have not met the entry requirements and are unsure about alternative options for your chosen subjects, you may come into school on Results Day between **08:45** and **10:30** to discuss alternative options with a member of the Senior Leadership Team (SLT).

Please note that the minimum Sixth Form entry requirement — 46 points from your best 8 GCSEs, including at least a Grade 5 in both English and Maths — must be met in order to enrol at BHS Sixth Form. **Students who do not meet this threshold will not be eligible for a place.**

If you do not meet the minimum entry requirement, we advise that you contact other schools/colleges to secure a place. For further support you will need to come into school and wait for an appointment with SLT.

Grade Queries and Review of Marks Requests

If your A-Level subject choice, or your place within the Sixth Form, depends on a particular grade, and you have not achieved this grade, then you will need to liaise with Mrs Cunningham, our Examinations Officer, who will be available in school on results day. Please note that any other queries about grades or requests for reviews of marking, will not be processed on results day; these should be made at the start of term after consultation with subject teachers.

Communication

We will send out an email on **Friday 14th August** to remind you about the logistics of the day. Please read this message so that you have the most up to date information about how the day will run. If you are experiencing problems logging into your school Office 365 account, please contact us as soon as possible so that we can help you **before** results day.

In summary, GCSE Results Day looks like this

- **08:15** - Electronic version of GCSE results sent out to all students at their BHS school email address. Please do be mindful that any technology or internet issues may delay this slightly.
- **08:30 – 09:45** - Collection of envelopes from the Main Hall.
- **08:45 – 10:30** - SLT available for meetings in Sixth Form Study Area (SFSA)
- **10:30** - Deadline for submitting student's enrolment form on Applicaa
