



### London Anthropology Day Conference, Friday 3rd October 2025

Dear Parents/Carers

I am pleased to invite your child to join Miss Gray and I in attending The London Anthropology Day on **Friday 3rd October 2025** at Senate House, London. This promises to be a superb opportunity for our students, with leading academics delivering lectures and workshops that explore a wide range of sociological and anthropological issues. The programme connects directly to core themes in the A Level Sociology specification, including gender, class, social inequality, and cultural diversity. Students will also have the chance to meet representatives from several universities, providing valuable insights into further study and career pathways within Sociology, Social Science, and the wider Humanities.

This educational visit is not a compulsory part of the school syllabus and is offered as an optional extra intended to complement the students' formal curriculum. The event is **free of charge**.

Students will meet teachers at Senate House at **10:30am** but they will be expected to travel into London independently and purchase their own train/tube ticket for the day (see travel suggestions below). If you feel you have financial circumstances which will cause difficulty in meeting either the cost of the trip or the cost of travel to and from the venue, please get in touch with me and I will arrange a time to call you to discuss.

Within the guidelines for educational visits produced by Buckinghamshire County Council and adopted by our Governors, it states that there are some visits that may be deemed (by the Headteacher) to be within the normal expectation for individual or small groups of sixth form students to undertake unaccompanied. This educational visit is deemed to be in this category.

It is, however, our duty to remind you of the risks associated with travelling independently to conference venues. As organiser of the visit, I have checked that the venue complies with British regulations for health and safety, e.g. fire, first aid etc. However, accidents may still happen whilst at the venue and on route.

The students have been fully briefed about the potential risks and expectations of the school in terms of behaviour and attendance at all the appropriate sections of the event. We recommend that your child arranges to travel to and from the venue in a small group and have a mobile phone to communicate with you and the school in case of any problems.

## How to Get to Senate House, London (near the British Museum)

### Students need to arrive at Senate House by 10:30am. Suggested Trains:

From Beaconsfield to London Marylebone

- 08:27 → 09:05
- 08:56 → 09:30

From High Wycombe to London Marylebone

- 08:19 → 09:05
- 08:37 → 09:09
- 08:44 → 09:13
- 08:49 → 09:30

From Amersham to London Marylebone

- 08:40 → 09:17

### Tube Connections from London Marylebone

- Take the Bakerloo line southbound to Oxford Circus.
- Change to the Central line (eastbound) and travel to Tottenham Court Road.
- From Tottenham Court Road, it is around a 10-minute walk to Senate House (next to the British Museum).

### Walking from Tottenham Court Road to Senate House

- Exit Tottenham Court Road station and head east towards Russell Square.
- Senate House is on Malet Street, just behind the British Museum.
