



Tutor2U Economics 'Strong Foundations' Workshop in London

Dear Parents/Carers and Students,

We would like to offer our students the opportunity to attend **the Tutor2U A-Level Economics (Edexcel) Strong Foundations workshop**. This will take place on **Wednesday, 26th November between 10:30 – 15:15 (registration from 09:45)**. Also included with attendance at this event is access to the supporting 'attendee hub' with downloadable resources and additional support materials.

The focus on the day is on exam skills and ensuring students have a deeper understanding of what they need to focus on to succeed in the 2026 exams. Throughout each session, specialised presenters will draw on topics and contexts that are based on content typically taught in Year 12 - the day is a great way for students to revise and recap Year 12 content too!

The cost is £47.50 (+ transport), and more information is available via this [link](#). Places are limited and selling fast.

Venue - Westfield White City (Vue Cinema), London, W12 7GF – myself and Mrs Ladha will meet the students on site. All students need to make their own way to and from the venue. If there are any issues on the day, I must be notified via email. Our students are extremely well-behaved and will be allowed to leave the cinema area for 50 – 60 minutes to relax over lunch and perhaps do some shopping but must ensure their phone is switched on and they check in with a teacher on their return at an agreed time before returning for a fast-paced, intensive afternoon session!

Parking - is available at the venue.

Registration – There is no need to bring a printed ticket. Students must come to the registration desk on arrival with their name and the name of our School, and they will check everyone in. All students should wait by the desk until we arrive.

What should be brought along? - Tutor2U usually provides every student with a workbook. Spare paper and a pen are required to add useful notes and jot down ideas. A calculator may be needed. However, most students will use their mobile phones.

This educational visit is important and intended to complement the students' formal curriculum. If you would like your child to participate, in accordance with the school's charging and remissions policy, you are asked to make a voluntary contribution of **£47.50** via SCOPAY (www.scopay.com/beaconsfield) by **Sunday 2nd November 2025**. We will then book the tickets on Monday, subject to availability.

Please note if there are insufficient contributions, the Visit/Trip may not take place.

Where students are entitled to the 16-19 Bursary, we ask that the students make the payments out of the money received from the bursary. If you are having difficulty meeting payment deadlines and wish to discuss a payment plan, please contact trips@beaconsfieldhigh.school

Within the guidelines for educational visits produced by Buckinghamshire County Council and adopted by our Governors, it states that there are some visits that may be deemed (by the Headteacher) to be within the normal expectation for individual or small groups of sixth form students to undertake unaccompanied. It is, however, our duty to remind you of the risks associated with travelling independently to conference venues and that accidents may still happen whilst at the venue and on route. The students have been fully briefed about the potential risks and expectations of the school in terms of behaviour and attendance at all the appropriate sections of the event. We recommend that your child arranges to travel to and from the venue in a small group and have a mobile phone to communicate with you and the school in case of any problems.
